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## **1. The Institute**

Indian Institute of Technology Bombay is one of the twenty-three national institutes of technology in the country set up with the objectives of making available the facilities for higher education, research and training in various fields of science and technology. Indian Institute of Technology Bombay was established in 1958 with the co-operation and participation of the erstwhile Government of USSR under UNESCO's Technical Assistance Programme.

The Institute is located at Powai, a suburb of Mumbai, on a campus spread over about 480 acres amidst picturesque surroundings with Vihar and Powai lakes on its either side. At present, it has eleven science and technology departments including Department of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) and fifteen interdisciplinary groups/centres/schools which offer various undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral programmes of studies.

## **2. Student Amenities**

The Institute is mostly residential and has 17 hostels for students. Each hostel is an independent entity with its own mess and recreation facilities. The Students' Gymkhana is very well equipped to provide facilities for sports, cultural programmes, National Social Service (NSS) and other extra-curricular activities. The various clubs at the Gymkhana and the Student Activity Centre encourage students to develop their talents in painting, music, photography, modelling and fabrication. The Institute also has good swimming pools on the campus.

Centre for Policy Studies is one of the more recent centres set up by the Institute. It has started its Ph.D. programme from the Autumn semester of 2017 and now has 45 doctoral students on its role. The Master's programme in Public Policy (MPP) began from the Autumn Semester of 2019.

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### 3. The MPP Programme

The Centre for Policy Studies (CPS) at IIT Bombay is an independent academic centre of the Institute. In order to meet a growing need and demand for policy professionals in India, it was thought necessary to start a Master's Programme in Public Policy (MPP) along with the PhD programme. The intake for Ph.D. was initiated from Autumn Semester of 2017. CPS launched its master's programme in Public Policy (MPP) from the Autumn semester of 2019.

CPS envisions myriad ways in which its PhD and MPP programmes and graduates from these programmes can contribute to IIT Bombay's intellectual diversity as well as to India's polity and society. The aim is to produce professionals or academics who seek to serve the public interest. These academic programmes will reflect the changing dynamics in today's world and the need for policy to keep pace with technological advancements, process of globalization, and increasingly nuanced and complex public debates about governance. Policy can no longer be contained within the realm of government and bureaucracy; it has to draw upon the civil society, academic institutions, and the private sector. Finally, CPS aims to capitalize on IIT Bombay's existing institutional strengths and build a centre that can be a hub for public policy research and expertise. CPS's academic programmes integrate public policy, social sciences, and technology.

### 4. Eligibility

The programme will be open to students from all backgrounds, provided they have completed a 4-year bachelor's degree post 10+2. A student should satisfy one of the following eligibility criteria:

- (i) A master's degree or a 4-year bachelor's degree (post 10+2) in Arts, Commerce, or equivalent with a minimum of 55% marks (50% marks for SC/ST) or equivalent letter grade/ GPA from a recognized institution or deemed university.
- (ii) M.Sc. degree or a 4-year B.Sc./B.S degree (post 10+2) or equivalent with a minimum of 60% marks (55% marks for SC/ST) or equivalent letter grade/ GPA from a recognized institution or deemed university.
- (iii) B. Tech./B.Arch degree or equivalent with a minimum of 60% marks or equivalent letter grade/ GPA (55% marks for SC/ST).

### 5. Total Number of Seats and Candidate Categories

Total Number of Seats: About 30 including TAships, Self Finance Candidates, Fellowship Award Candidates and In- Service Candidates.

CPS will offer about 10-12 TAships per academic year. **Candidates applying for Institute's TAship will be required to submit valid GATE scores to be considered for the same.**

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All interested candidates (TAship applicants as well as others) will be required to appear for CPS's entrance exam. Successful candidates will be invited for an interview, only after which their admission to the programme can be confirmed.

The MPP programme will be open to all Self Finance (SF) candidates including fresh candidates, candidates with work experience and in service candidates subject to:

1. Candidates without any work experience WILL NEED to submit a VALID GATE score.
2. SF/SW/FA candidates with 2 years plus work experience WILL NOT NEED to submit a VALID GATE score

In service candidates, working in government organizations or a Public Sector Undertaking, must ensure that their organization will permit them to undertake the requisite course work and project, for the duration of the MPP programme.

The MPP programme will also be open to all FA category candidates, receiving fellowships or scholarships from government or semi-government agencies. These may include fresh candidates and candidates with work experience.

The financial support under the FA category may be provided by various Govt./Semi Govt. schemes (CSIR, UGC, DAE, DST, DBT, NBHM, etc.) and some other organizations. A valid Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) award letter from the Govt. / Semi Govt. agency (e.g., CSIR / UGC / DAE / DST / DBT / NBHM / etc.) is required for the execution of this fellowship/scholarship.

Candidates of all categories, will be required, to have fulfilled the minimum eligibility criteria mentioned above.

NOTE: No candidate will be exempt from appearing for CPS's entrance exam and interview in order to be considered for the MPP programme. Valid GATE Score is required if the candidate is to be considered for TAship.

## **6. Employment/Career Opportunities**

Through its programmes, CPS aims to give its students tools which are applicable in diverse situations and teach students how to adapt to various fields, contexts, or situations. Students of the programmes can then find themselves fitting into and contributing to the public or private sectors, working within the government, or in the not-for-profit/ NGO sector. They may choose to work for large corporations as analysts or lobbyists, or may do policy research in IOs, think tanks, or Universities.

**NOTE:**

- (a) Students, permitted to take temporary withdrawal from the programme for one or more semesters, will be required to pay Rs. 2000/- as a continuation fee per semester.
- (b) \*Fee components B - (6 to 8) will be applicable only to the students who are permitted to stay on campus in hostels, will opt to do so and be allotted a room. The charges against fee components B - (6 to 8) will be NIL for those who are NOT permitted to stay on campus in hostels or do NOT opt to stay even if permitted (such students will not be eligible for any medical benefits normally available to students paying the fee against B - 6.

- (c) <sup>§</sup>Fee components B - (9-10) will be applicable to all students, who will be allotted a room during this semester, whether permitted to stay on campus in hostel or not, for the upkeep and maintenance of the hostel and mess facilities.
- (d) Every student, staying in hostel, has to pay a "per semester mess advance" of Rs.27,000/-.
- (e) In view of the COVID-19 pandemic, all students, who would be permitted to stay on campus in hostels are required to get the COVID-19 health insurance on their own for a minimum period covering the period of their semesterly stay, before commencement of their stay on campus. The premium paid towards this insurance will be reimbursable up to Rs 500/-, out of the Medical Fee paid, against policy payment invoice/ receipt. Such students need to send an email mentioning their (Name, Roll No. and Hostel No.) with the subject as "Request for Covid Medical Insurance Premium Reimbursement" along with self attested photo copy of Health Insurance Policy / Premium Paid Receipt to Dean SA office (Email: dean.sa.office@iitb.ac.in) for reimbursement.
- (f) Students who are staying in quarters, such as MRSB / Tulsi / QIP, etc. are required to pay License fee, F.R, etc. as applicable to these quarters, as per Estate Office rules.
- (g) IIT Bombay reserves the right to revise the fee structure in subsequent semesters.
- (h) <sup>§</sup>Students, who do not wish to stay on campus in hostels for the entire duration of their program i.e. they opt to remain as day scholars throughout the period of their program till completion, may be exempted from payment of fee components B - (6 to 10). Such students will not be allotted a hostel room and will not be eligible for any medical facility from the Institute. If at any later date, such a student wishes to be allotted a hostel room to stay on campus, this will be subject to availability and payment of fee components B - (9-10) for all previous semesters from the date of joining the program to the semester in which room is allotted, besides payment of all fee components B - (6 to 10) from the semester of room allotment.

Candidates opted for Hostel Accommodation have to submit the Mess Advance of Rs.27,000/- by ONLINE payment/Net Banking as per the link provided in the online admission portal, at the time of joining the Institute hostel.
